Hopkins was a Jesuit priest whose poetry was not published until after his death. It broke the rules of poetry and left us with some of the most memorable lines ever:

The world is charged with the grandeur of God, it will flame out, like shining from shook foil...

Hopkins saw the essence of God in all that God has made and the language of his poetry draws us into the same intimacy.

Over 600 years before Hopkins, Rumi a Persian poet, Islamic scholar, theologian and Sufi mystic drew his followers into a Divine Dance where finding and being found by the Beloved is the soul's purpose. Rumi crosses all cultural and faith divides with his language of love.

+ ★ Mystic Series 6: John of the Cross


