Why don't people do it my way?? Introduction to the Enneagram

Have you ever been in situation where you seem to be banging your head against a brick wall? You have explained a situation a hundred times but your companion, child, colleague doggedly refuse to see it your way! The simple answer is that they have a different way of looking at the world. They are just different!

To get a handle on these differences there is an ancient yet very modern tool to help understand where others are coming from. Of course everyone is unique and different – but this knowledge is self-evident and not very useful. The *Enneagram Personality System* enables people to determine their unique perception of the world and to also understand *why* they came to believe in it – and what motivates them. To make this manageable, these perceptions have been grouped into nine sectors which is the basis for the nine Enneagram types. As we are all different we will have some characteristics of all nine types although one type will predominate.

Through these two introductory workshops, participants will discover the way this system operates and also to find their own personality type.
