

Arranging Your Group's Visit

The Mary MacKillop Museum is located within the Mary MacKillop Precinct, the very place where Australia's first canonised saint lived and worked for some 11 years. The recently refurbished Museum highlights Mary MacKillop's time in Adelaide, the work of her pioneering sisters and the legacy they left, making use of hands-on, interactive technologies. Presenting a little slice of South Australia's history, there is a story to touch every heart.

Opening Times

The Mary MacKillop Museum is open Tuesday to Friday 10am to 4pm and Saturday 10am to 1pm, except for Public Holidays, when we are closed. Bookings are considered on Sundays and Mondays by negotiation.

Museum Admission

Tour Group Minimum 10 people: \$8 each

Suggested Length

We recommend that you allow between 60-90 minutes for the visit. The length of your visit can, of course, be arranged to suit the group's needs.

Prior to the Visit

Precinct staff can advise on a suggested itinerary that can include the Mary MacKillop Walk around Kensington and Norwood, a visit to St Joseph's Chapel and morning tea or lunch at [High Street Café](#).



During the Visit

- Groups are welcomed to the Mary MacKillop Precinct and an overview of the Museum is provided.
- Individuals are then free to make their own way around the museum. A map is provided for all visitors.
- Groups may wish to book Bethany for a ½ or full day retreat. Separate charges apply for the use of Bethany.
- The Museum Gift Shop will open to browse.
- A visit to St Joseph's Chapel, where Mary MacKillop prayed, is available. Please confirm this with your booking.

Facilities and Access

- Back packs and larger bags must be stored in lockers. The Museum takes all care but accepts no responsibility for belongings left in the lockers.
- The Mary MacKillop Museum is wheelchair friendly.

Photography

Photography is permitted in all areas of the Mary MacKillop Precinct, however **flash** photography is **not** permitted in the Museum.
